Summer Work 2019

The curriculum for Algebra II Honors is both fast paced and challenging. We work mostly without calculators and use fractions all the time. To ensure that you are able to succeed from day one, you will complete a series of assignments over the summer on DeltaMath. The due date for these assignments is August 27, 2019(the first day of school). The assignments can be done week by week or all together towards the end of the summer. They are spread out to help you pace yourself. They will not be graded until August 27. All together, the assignments will count as a major homework grade.

The assignments will be posted weekly(not all at once) starting July 1<sup>st</sup>. There will be a total of 8 assignments.

If you have a DeltaMath account, you will need to add a new teacher.

Go to the “Tools” menu(upper right corner)

Choose “Manage Login and Teachers”

Choose “Add Teacher”

Enter 224201

Choose Algebra II Honors

If you do not have a DeltaMath account:

Go to [www.deltamath.com](http://www.deltamath.com)

Choose “Create Account” (upper right hand corner)

Enter Teacher code 224201

Complete the form(use your school email and password)

Choose Algebra II Honors

The website is mostly intuitive, however it may take a bit of playing around to understand how answers must be entered. Be sure to click on the keyboard button so you have access to mathematical notation. There are examples and solutions for each problem type within the program. There is no penalty for wrong answers(although this is not always the case). You may use a calculator for operations that you are not comfortable with, but keep in mind that during the school year we will not be using calculators.
